# HISTORY

# TEST HISTORY

**1992 World Cup Victory:** The pinnacle of Pakistan's cricketing success came in 1992 when they won the ICC Cricket World Cup, though they were more dominant in limited-overs cricket at this stage, their Test performances remained competitive.

**Legendary Players:** During the 80s and 90s, Pakistan produced cricketing legends like Wasim Akram, Waqar Younis, Javed Miandad, and Inzamam-ul-Haq. The combination of fast bowling and solid batting made Pakistan a formidable Test team.

## 2000s – A Period of Struggles and Scandals:

**Match-fixing Scandal:** Pakistan faced a huge blow in the late 1990s and early 2000s due to match-fixing scandals that involved key players. This tarnished their image, and the team's performance in Test cricket suffered during this time.

**Return to Form:** Despite controversies, Pakistan managed to regroup with captains like Younis Khan and Misbah-ul-Haq. Players like Shahid Afridi and Mohammad Yousuf kept the team competitive in Test matches.

**Major Series Wins:** Pakistan managed to defeat top teams like India, South Africa, and England, though consistency was often lacking.

## Recent Developments (2010s-Present):

**Misbah-ul-Haq's Leadership:** After a period of uncertainty in the 2000s, Misbah-ul-Haq became captain in 2010, and under his leadership, Pakistan reached new heights in Test cricket. The team's discipline and composure were greatly improved under Misbah's captaincy.

**Record-breaking Achievements:** Under Misbah's captaincy, Pakistan achieved major feats, including a No. 1 ranking in Test cricket in 2016. This was a monumental achievement, as Pakistan had not been ranked No. 1 in Tests before.



## 90st century performance



From 1970 to 1979, Pakistan played over 13 Test series, which they won 3, lost 5 and drew 5. In total of 41 Test matches, Pakistan won 6, lost 12 and drew 23. They had a below par performance. But from 1980 to 1989, they did better. Out of 21 Test series they have played from that period, they won 9, lost 5 and drew 7. In terms of matches, they played total of 72 matches, winning 20 and losing 12 with 40 draws. In 1987, Pakistan went to India for five match series. It was Sunil Gavaskar's last test series. The first four test went draw but the final match was thriller. Pakistan scored 116 before India scored 143. Pakistan came back with 249 on board, giving the host a target of 220. India fell 16 runs short and the series was considered one of the best India-Pakistan series. In 1988, after West Indies tour where they drew 1-1 (3), Pakistan were rated as No.1 Test team. It was one of greatest moments in their history.

From 1990 to 1999, Pakistan did even better. They played 29 series, winning over 15 and losing 9 with 5 drawn. In terms of matches, they played 74, winning 40, losing 21 and drawing 13. In this period, the lowest point of for Pakistan came in 1998 where they lost to Zimbabwe 1-0 in three match series. The biggest moment came in Asian Test Championship in 1998 where they defeated Sri Lanka in the final by an innings and 175 runs.

### Key Achievements from 1970 to 1999

ICC Cricket World Cup 1992: Pakistan's greatest cricketing achievement, winning the tournament under the leadership of Imran Khan.

1986 Austral-Asia Cup: The memorable victory against India.

Test and ODI Series Victories: Throughout the 1970s to 1999, Pakistan won numerous Test and ODI series, establishing themselves as one of the top teams globally.

Improvement in bowling: The rise of legendary bowlers like Wasim Akram, Waqar Younis, and Shoaib Akhtar made Pakistan one of the most potent bowling attacks in world cricket during this era.

## 21st century performance

### ASIAN TEST CHAMPIONSHIP

In 2002, Pakistan participated in their second Asian Test Championship. It was originally planned to include all four Asian ICC full-members (Bangladesh, India, Pakistan and Sri Lanka). However, before the tournament started, India's participation was put in doubt. After defeating Bangladesh in the 1st Test to meet Sri Lanka in the final, they were defeated by them by 8 wickets.



### 2006 ball-tampering controversy

A major controversy occurred in 2006 when the team toured England for a four-match Test series. England led the series 2-0 going into the final Test. In the first innings of that match, they were bowled out for 173 and Pakistan scored 504 in reply. In the second innings, after the dismissal of Alastair Cook for 83 off a reverse-swinging from Umar Gul, umpires Darrell Hair and Billy Doctrove called a halt to play as they adjudged Pakistan to be guilty of ball tampering. The ball was replaced and England was awarded 5 penalty runs. This event was the catalyst for the subsequent refusal to continue the match after tea by the Pakistan team. Based on the Laws of Cricket, the umpires declared Pakistan to have forfeited the game. The ICC later changed the result of the match to a draw, and subsequently reinstated the original result on 1 February 2009.



## 2010 SPOT FIXING SCANDAL



The Pakistan cricket team toured England from 29 July to 22 September 2010. The tour consisted of four Tests, two T20Is and five ODIs. During the Test series, Pakistan lost the first two Test by 354 runs and 9 wickets. They came back to win the third Test by 4 wickets. However, in the fourth Test, the spot-fixing took place. On the third day of the 4th Test, British newspaper News of the World published a story with allegations that an agent loosely affiliated with some of the Pakistani players (later identified as Mashaar Majeed) had accepted a £150,000 (US\$352,665) bribe from undercover reporters for information that two Pakistani bowlers (Mohammad Asif and Mohammad Amir) would deliberately deliver no balls at specific points during the match.[36] The third player was also caught. It was Pakistan's Test skipper Salman Butt, who was revealed to be the master mind of this case. On 1 November 2011, Asif, Amir, and Butt were found guilty for their part in the spot-fixing and were given prison sentences, ranging from six months to 30 months and now Amir played well.

### Pakistan Players Arrested:

Mohammad Amir was arrested in September 2010, and both Salman Butt and Mohammad Asif were arrested shortly after. They were charged with conspiracy to cheat, and they were also accused of violating the ICC's anti-corruption code.

Conviction: In November 2011, the three cricketers were sentenced in a UK court:

Salman Butt (the captain) received a 30-month prison sentence for his role in the spot-fixing scandal. Mohammad Asif was sentenced to 1 year in prison. Mohammad Amir, being younger and less involved, received a 6-month prison sentence.



Additionally, the players were banned from cricket by the ICC: Salman Butt received a 10-year ban (5 years of which were suspended). Mohammad Asif was given a 7-year ban (2 years of which were suspended). Mohammad Amir received a 5-year ban, which was later lifted after his suspension ended in 2015.

## ODI WORLDCUP HISTORY



### 1. 1979 Cricket World Cup:

Host: England

Result: Pakistan did not qualify for the semifinals.

Details: The 1979 World Cup was Pakistan's first participation in the tournament, but they failed to make it past the group stages. The competition was dominated by the West Indies, who went on to win the tournament.

### 2. 1983 Cricket World Cup:

Host: England

Result: Did not qualify for the semifinals.

Details: Pakistan's performance in the 1983 World Cup was disappointing, as they failed to qualify for the knockout stages. The tournament is more famous for India's unexpected victory, but Pakistan's early exit added to the team's frustration.

### 3. 1987 Cricket World Cup:

Host: India and Pakistan

Result: Eliminated in the semifinals.

Details: This was the first World Cup held in Pakistan, and the team made a significant improvement, reaching the semifinals. They faced Australia in the semifinal but were defeated by Australia at Lahore, which ended their campaign.

### 4. 1992 Cricket World Cup:

Host: Australia and New Zealand

Result: Winners (Champions).

Details: This remains one of the most iconic moments in Pakistan's cricket history. Led by Imran Khan, Pakistan won the 1992 Cricket World Cup by defeating England in the final at the Melbourne Cricket Ground (MCG).

Pakistan had a rough start to the tournament but made a dramatic comeback under Imran's leadership.

Waqar Akram was the hero of the final, with an unforgettable all-round performance, scoring crucial runs and taking key wickets.

This victory remains Pakistan's only World Cup win to date.

### 5. 1996 Cricket World Cup:

Host: India, Pakistan, and Sri Lanka

Result: Eliminated in the Quarterfinals.

Details: Pakistan was one of the co-hosts of the 1996 World Cup but faced disappointment by being

knocked out in the quarterfinals by India.

The match against India in Bangalore was a highly anticipated encounter, but Pakistan lost the match. Aamer Sohail and Shahid Afridi were some of the standout performers for Pakistan.

#### 6. 1999 Cricket World Cup:

Host: England

Result: Runners-up.

Details: Pakistan's 1999 World Cup campaign was remarkable as they reached the final, where they faced Australia.

Pakistan's team, led by Wasim Akram, played some dominant cricket during the tournament.

In the final, Pakistan faced a powerful Australian team and was bowled out for just 132 runs. Australia easily chased down the target to win their second consecutive World Cup.
